Towards excellence in service and care

Essex County Council is committed to delivering safe, effective services which make a real and positive difference to the lives of the people who use them.

Our commitment to you

We will:

- 1. Treat you politely and considerately and with respect;
- 2. Listen and respond to you;
- 3. Make it easy for you to get the right service;
- 4. Be clear about what we can and cannot provide;
- 5. Work with you to make sure that services meet your needs;
- 6. Put things right when they go wrong;
- 7. Be fair and open.

If you have a visual impairment you can get a range of support from organisations in Essex.

You do not need to be registered to have support and can make a self referral to Essex County Council.

Getting registered

To get a CVI (certificate of visual impairment) you will need to see an eye consultant to confirm you are classified as sight impaired or severely sight impaired as described on the certificate. Your GP can put you in contact with a consultant if you haven't already seen one. The consultant will complete a certification form, known as a CVI and send a copy to your GP and to Essex County Council who will contact you and arrange for you to be registered should you wish to be.

Your consultant should also send you a copy of your certificate. You should make sure you receive this and keep it in a safe place.

"Being told you are blind or partially sighted (severely sight impaired or sight impaired) may come as a great shock but please don't refuse certification. It can open some helpful avenues and you really owe it to yourself to make sure you get all the help and advice at this point in your life."

Registering with Essex County Council

When Social Care Direct has received your CVI certificate we will contact you and ask if you would like to be registered. This register helps us to provide the best service we can to people with a visual impairment. Registration is voluntary and your details are kept confidential.

The benefits of registering

Once you have agreed to register with Essex County Council, we will send you a registration card. This card is proof that you are either sight impaired or severely sight impaired. It can help in many places, for example you may be entitled to help with travel.

Low vision services

Low vision services can supply appliances and magnifiers, which may enable you to make the best use of your remaining vision.

Referrals to the low vision service can be made via your GP or your consultant.

Social Care, Essex County Council – Sensory services - supporting you at home

You will be assessed to see if you require a visit from a social worker or a rehabilitation worker, who are specially trained in supporting visually impaired people of all ages to live safely and independently at home. Here are some of the ways they can help:

- 1. Advise you how you can make daily living and mobility easier and safer for yourself;
- 2. Give you information on equipment and 'gadgets' that could help you;
- 3. Advise you of benefits you could be entitled to, such as Disability Living Allowance or Attendance Allowance;
- 4. Provide advice on ways to get back to work, if you are of working age;
- 5. Provide support and advice on your educational needs;
- Help arrange training and advise on special computer software;
- 7. Advise where you can get large print and audio books;
- 8. Get you on the mailing list of your local talking newspaper.

If you would like a social worker or rehabilitation worker to visit you in your home a visit will be arranged as soon as possible. Alternatively in some areas you may be offered a home visit from a local voluntary group.
